 Prayer is not a normal part of the life of the natural man. We hear it said that a
 person's life will suffer if he doesn't pray, but I question that. What will suffer is the
 life of the Son of God in him, which is nourished not by food, but by prayer. When a
 person is born again from above, the life of the Son of God is born in him, and he can
 either starve or nourish that life. Prayer is the way that the life of God in us is
 nourished. Our common ideas regarding prayer are not found in the New Testament.
 We look upon prayer simply as a means of getting things for ourselves, but the
 biblical purpose of prayer is that we may get to know God Himself.
- God is ready to _______ through authentic prayer. Isaiah 40:28-31 Do you not know? Have you not heard? The Everlasting God, the LORD, the Creator of the ends of the earth does not become weary or tired. His understanding is inscrutable. 29 He gives strength to the weary, and to *him who* lacks might He increases power. 30 Though youths grow weary and tired, and vigorous young men stumble badly, 31 Yet those who wait for the LORD will gain new strength; they will mount up *with* wings like eagles, they will run and not get tired, they will walk and not become weary.
