1 Corinthians 13:4-8 Love is patient, love is kind and is not jealous; love does not brag and is not arrogant, 5 does not act unbecomingly; it does not seek its own, is not provoked, does not take into account a wrong suffered, 6 does not rejoice in unrighteousness, but rejoices with the truth; 7 bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. 8 Love never fails.

	1 Corinthians 13:6 "Love does not rejoice in unrighteousness, but rejoices with the truth."
	Celebrating others requires ain others.  Philippians 2:3-4 Do nothing from selfishness or empty conceit, but with humility of mind regard one another as more important than yourselves; 4 do not merely look out for your own personal interests, but also for the interests of others.
	Celebrating others requires an in other people.
	Romans 12:15 Rejoice with those who rejoice, and weep with those who weep.
2.	Love Celebrates
	1 Corinthians 13:6 "Love does not rejoice in unrighteousness, but rejoices with the truth."
	- Consider the contrast between unrighteousness and truth.
	- John 14:6 "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me."
	- How do we celebrate truth in one another?
	We know what the life of Christ looks like.
	We look for that quality in one another.
	We point it out and celebrate it when we see it.

3. Love Celebrates \_\_\_\_\_

- How often do you rejoice with the truth?

- 1 Corinthians 13:6 "Love does not rejoice in unrighteousness, but rejoices with the truth."
- Romans 12:2 "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed."
- The Greek word used in that verse is the same word from which we get our word metamorphosis.

- Genesis 1:26 Then God said, "Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness...
- Galatians 4:19 My children, with whom I am again in labor until Christ is formed in you.
- It's rejoicing in the process we see happening in another person's life of becoming like Christ.
- Part of this rejoicing means not being content with anything less than transformation.
- It means transformation is our personal goal, and it also means celebrating transformation in others.
- Romans 8:29 For those whom He foreknew, He also predestined to become conformed to the image of His Son...
