	<ul> <li>Protecting love means it "" Ephesians 4:29 Let no unwholesome word proceed from your mouth, but only such a word as is good for edification according to the need of the moment, so that it will give grace to those who hear.  - Think of some ways you can protect or cover your friend.  - One writer (Richard Pratt) said, "If he had in mind the concept of covering, then he may have meant that love will not seek to expose the sins of others. Love handles the sins of others in ways that will not bring exposure or shame."  - What do we do when a friend or church member or fellow Christian says or does something not befitting a Christian?  - Rick Warren: "Fellowship is a place of grace, where mistakes aren't rubbed in but rubbed out."</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>Real love is discerning.</li> <li>1 Corinthians 13:6 "[Love] does not rejoice in unrighteousness but rejoices with the truth."</li> </ul>

- 1 Timothy 4:10 For it is for this we labor and strive, because we have fixed our hope on the living God, who is the Savior of all men, especially of believers.
- Hoping in others is rooted in the \_\_\_\_\_\_ of God. Philippians 2:13 It is God who is at work in you, both to will and to work for *His* good pleasure.
- Hoping in others means we never \_\_\_\_\_ on one another.
